Healthcare Ocean's vision is to conserve and protect marine ecosystems through minimizing harm resulting from the procurement and delivery of healthcare. Greener Operations James Lind Priority Setting Partnership

Who is James Lind? I hear you cry! Well, the James Lind Alliance is an NIHR funded, non-profit making initiative that identifies important unanswered research questions.

Operation are amongst the most resource intensive healthcare interventions; each operating theatre creates around two tonnes of waste per year and a single operation can generate a carbon footprint equivalent to driving more than 2000 miles. If the NHS is to meet its 'net zero' carbon emissions pledge by 2040 it is imperative that we make operations 'greener'

The James Lind Alliance is running a research priority setting partnership for greener operations to identify the top 10 areas that future sustainability research in this area should focus on. The survey will open in the coming weeks and as many people as possible are encouraged to select their 'top 10'. The survey, can be found <u>here</u>.

THE NITROUS OXIDE **PROJECT: MITIGATION**


Nitrous Oxide can be a fantastic and useful medicine, but did you know it is a greenhouse gas and is >250x more potent that CO₂. This innovative project is not only reviewing Nitrous Oxide use in clinical settings but also investigating sources of clinical waste and system leak.

REGIONAL AUDIT INHALATION ANAESTHETIC USE

More great work from NEASH (Northeast Anaesthetist's for Sustainable Healthcare). When it comes to environmental impact, not all anaesthetic gases are made equal. Desflurane and nitrous oxide are significantly more damaging to the environment and are referred to as blue gases (Fig1)



The region wide audit looked at the use of the gases around the area and found every centre in the region and was coupled with an education message regarding more sustainable alternatives such as TIVA (total intravenous anaesthesia) and sevoflurane. Fig 2 shows significant regional variation (trust names removed).

PRIMARY CARE PROJECTS

There is also some fantastic work being carried out in Primary Care. We have a number of passionate trainees and clinicians involved with sustainability projects and we have highlighted a couple of different examples that will hopefully inspire you to get started in your clinical area.

PESSARY POWER!

Definitely a phrase I didn't expect to write in Sustainability Matters. This fantastic SusQI project carried out by GP Registrar, Abby Lewis Barned, is a perfect example of a project that identified a sustainable alternative that creates less plastic waste and saves the NHS money without compromising patient care triple whammy (bottom line).

Oestrogen pessaries are very commonly prescribed for the management of post-menopausal urogenital symptoms. The most commonly prescribed pessary is Vagifem, with each tablet coming with its own plastic applicator. A simple switch to Vagirux, that comes with a single, reusable applicator could save 15.6million plastic applicators from landfill each year. Mind Blown!!! GREEN IMPACT: HEALTH TOOLKIT





Dr Jake Shepherd GP<u>ST3</u> Jake Shepherd is one of the GPST3's working at The Village Surgery in Silksworth. As part of his training Jake is completing an integrated care post at Sunderland Medical School with a focus on Sustainable Healthcare.

Throughout his training Jake has been interested in climate change and its impact on health and has integrated the Green Impact for Health Toolkit at multiple practices. Jake has completed 35 sustainable actions, including:

- Switching to recycled paper
 - Reducing single use plastic by introducing wipeable aprons
- Reducing water use by using washing up bowlsWorking with pharmacy to reduce inappropriate
- polypharmacy

Jake and the team at the Village Surgery have recently been awarded the Green Impact bronze award and are already working towards the silver.

Jake's fantastic work highlights the importance of making small changes that, collectively, can make a big difference and how when you have a cohesive team with a common goal, progress is possible. I think we can all learn important lessons from this.
